Hydrotherapy Instructions



These instructions are describing hydrotherapy in the most ideal conditions. Your goal will be to analyze your situation and come as close to these conditions as possible.

- **Run your sink faucet until the water is very warm but not so warm that you cannot hold your arm under it for an extended period of time.**
- **Place your small pet into the sink.**
- **Using the spray nozzle from the sink, spray the affected area for five minutes washing away the necrotic tissue, blood, and dried-on material.**
- **Soak a hand or dish towel in the running water.**
- **Turn off the sink faucet.**
- **Ring (slightly) some of the water out of the towel so that the towel is still soaking wet but not dripping.**
- **Press the soaking wet towel on the area and gently clean any remaining residue from the skin surrounding the wound.**
- **Repeat this process three times per day unless another frequency is listed here: Instead of three times per day, do this _____ times per day.**

Again, as I indicated earlier, get as close to these conditions as you can. You obviously won't be able to do this with an incredibly large dog or extremely fractious (angry, vicious) cat.

For the larger dogs, consider doing this outside with a garden hose. You can possibly connect the hose to an indoor sink faucet or just run it at the temperature coming from the tap.

For fractious animals, be as careful and gentle as possible. Please do not allow your pet to break anything or injure themselves during this process. Of course, I am leaving this process up to your best judgement. You CAN bring your pet in for treatment if you wish. The charge will be \$3.50 per minute per technician performing the therapy.
